Reva Rundell is starting a project called "Jennifer's Quilts" in honor of her daughter, Jennifer aka "J". Quilts will be made for at least 30 young adults living in seven group homes in Hood County. Reva will coordinate with the quilters volunteering to make the quilts.

Lynne and Wanda Greene met with a veteran named Ken Horton. They discussed making quilts for veterans. He heads a program called "Vets Ride Free," which provides rides to veterans to doctor appointments at VA hospitals all over the metroplex. The VA provides the vans. Mr. Horton asked if the first quilts that the guild volunteers make could be made for the vans in lap,k wheelchair and twin sizes. Lynne and Wanda want to make quilts related to all five branches of service.

Lynne handed out the 2017 Community Service Hours log sheets and encouraged the members to keep a log of all time and money they spend on projects.

Please join us for the 2017 Rally Day on Saturday, July 8th to be held at the Mimosa Lane Baptist Church as 1233 N. Belt Line Road, Mesquite, TX. for a day of fun, beautiful quilts, information, raffles and lots of friendship. Doors open at 9:00am. Rally Day is free to TAQG members with a general admission charge of \$5.00

Our featured speaker is Cynthia LeBlanc Regone who will be doing two lectures. Cynthia started quilting in 1981 and within ten years was producing award-winning quilts. She lectures and teaches throughout the United States. She has served on the board of several state and local guilds in Oklahoma and Texas. She was a featured teacher at the 31st Annual National Quilting Association Show in 2000 and teaches at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas.

Several of her designs have been featured in Fons and Porters magazine *Love of Quilting*, Quilt Works Today, and Quilting Today magazines. Her quilt "Red Hot Flannel" was featured in the 2005 Love of Quilting Calendar. In April 2007, That Patchwork Place published her first quilting book "Colorful Quilts - A Journey Through Fabric". A separate pattern has been distributed by Martingale Press for her quilt design titled "Sweet Pea Manor". Her quilt "Cherry Picking Time" appeared in the 2008 Calendar for That Patchwork Place. Her quilt "Black Eyed Susans" was one of 15 quilts featured in the Martingale Press book Creaive Quilts Vol. III, which was published in the spring of 2008. True to her Louisiana roots, Cynthia designs under her own quilt pattern label named Cajun Classics.

Community Service

March 2017 25 quilts to Granbury Care Center 5 flannel quilts to Ada Carey Center

4 quilts to CASA 1 quilt & 6 blankets to Harris Hospital

Our speaker this month is Ken Horton. His story: Ken is a Navy veteran and served in Viet Nam and several US locations as a Radioman. He is retired from his civilian career with the railroad. He and his wife Donna have lived in Granbury almost 30 years and they have 5 sons and 11 ½ grandchildren(1 on the way!). Ken has a Masters Degree in Theology and a Bachelors in Christian Counseling. Ken has held many volunteer positions and is currently the Director for the Hood County Jail Ministry. He joined the staff at Mission Granbury as the Veteran's Affairs Officer in June 2016. His wife is currently the Director of Joseph's Locker, a Christ-centered food and clothing outreach ministry here in Hood County.

Just as a reminder, the following are suggested sizes for our community service projects:

For Harris Texas Health Resources Neonatal units:

(Any and all sizes are greatly appreciated) Preemie quilts (can be pastel or bright colors) 18" square to 36" square. Soft cottons or flannel on top and backing. No batting is needed for quilts using flannel. No tied quilts for these tiny ones. No fleece is allowed in the hospital, as fleece can harbor germs even after washing. Isolette covers 36"x46" made with batting. According to the NICU Neonatal Supervisor, Stephanie Eidson, the quiet darker environment of a covered isolette help the babies sleep and grow better.

For CASA Babies and Children:

These are suggested finished lengths of the quilts for our CASA children. They are sized so they are about 10 inches longer than the average height of a child at that age. Children's quilts don't have to be fancy. Please make them in BRIGHT, CHILD APPROPRIATE FABRICS. They will be dragged around, machine washed and loved to pieces.

Newborn through 1: Up to 44" or 42" square — Age 2 through 4: 45" to 47" length (44-45" wide) Age 4 through 6: 47" to 52" length (45-46" wide) — Age 7 through 8: 53" to 55" length (46-48" wide) Age 9 through 10: 57" to 59" length (50" wide) — Age 11 and older: 62" length (50" wide) The width of the quilts should be no more than 50" for the older kids. These quilts are just for loving and dragging around, not for their beds. These are approximate sizes. We frequently have children that are only one year apart in the same family, so it is nice if the 3-year-old child has a quilt that is smaller than a 4-year-old sibling, for example. We will happily accept any quilt, but these suggested sizes make it easier to have the right size and age appropriate quilt available.

Quilts Beyond Borders:

40"- 45" wide & 48"- 60" long in kid friendly fabrics (https://quiltsbeyondborders.wordpress.com for more information)

Nursing Home Throws and Wheelchair Quilts:

Suggested sizes for wheelchair 38"-40" wide by 40"-46" long and for lap 50"-55" wide by 60"-70" long. (However, we will find homes for any size you make.) We need patriotic quilts for veterans. Their eyes light up when they see them and appreciate their service being recognized.
