# Message from the 2nd VP...

At our September meeting we will be welcoming MJ Fielek with a program on Bucket List Quilts, about those harder quilts that we all say we want to make "someday." Double wedding ring, lone star, feather star, pickle dish, mariner's compass and many more will be covered, including tips and available tools to make these guilts easier. MJ is the bindings queen in our area and will give a workshop on bindings on Tuesday, September 20. Included in the workshop will be two-color bindings, binding with a tuck, stuffed binding and perfect corners. The workshop will be at the United Electric Coop, 320 Fall Creek Highway. The workshop will be from 9am to 1pm and the cost will be \$35 which also covers a kit of supplies. A list of other supplies needed is on page 6 of this newsletter. When we use the Electric Coop facilities, we can use the close parking spots for unloading but please park to the rear of the lot when finished unloading.

Sharon Walker will be here in October, speaking on Silk Ribbon Embroidery by Machine. She will be using the techniques in Susan Schrempf's book Silk Ribbon Embroidery by Machine for the workshop on Tuesday following the meeting. The cost for this work-

shop will be \$30 and it will also be at the United Electric Coop. Supply list, examples and signup will be at the September meeting. Class will be from 9-3 so you may want to bring a lunch. Refrigerator and microwave are available.

## Community Service

At the August Guild meeting we received back five quilt tops from the kits that Lynne Schoeneman distributed at the Sit & Sew day and several quilt tops for CASA. Seven CASA quilts were delivered to Mission Granbury during August as well as five kid's flannel quilts for the Ada Carey Center.

Lynne Schoeneman is helping out with cutting out and distributing kits for nursing home and quilts beyond borders. She'll have kits with her at the September Guild meeting. Please consider taking one and making it for community service. We'll need quite a few more quilts, both lap and wheelchair size for delivery to Trinity Mission in December.

Just as a reminder, the following are suggested sizes for our community service projects:

#### For Harris Texas Health Resources Neonatal units:

(Any and all sizes are greatly appreciated) Preemie quilts (can be pastel or bright colors) 18" square to 36" square. Soft cottons or flannel on top and backing. No batting is needed for quilts using flannel. No tied quilts for these tiny ones. No fleece is allowed in the hospital, as fleece can harbor germs even after washing. Isolette covers 36"x46" made with batting. According to the NICU Neonatal Supervisor, Stephanie Eidson, the quiet darker environment of a covered isolette help the babies sleep and grow better.

### For CASA Babies and Children:

These are suggested finished lengths of the quilts for our CASA children. They are sized so they are about 10 inches longer than the average height of a child at that age. Children's quilts don't have to be fancy. Please make them in BRIGHT, CHILD APPROPRIATE FABRICS. They will be dragged around, machine washed and loved to pieces.

Newborn through 1: Up to 44" or 42" square — Age 2 through 4: 45" to 47" length (44-45" wide) Age 4 through 6: 47" to 52" length (45-46" wide) — Age 7 through 8: 53" to 55" length (46-48" wide)

Age 9 through 10: 57" to 59" length (50" wide) — Age 11 and older: 62" length (50" wide)

The width of the quilts should be no more than 50" for the older kids. These quilts are just for loving and dragging around, not for their beds. These are approximate sizes. We frequently have children that are only one year apart in the same family, so it is nice if the 3-year-old child has a quilt that is smaller than a 4-year-old sibling, for example. We will happily accept any quilt, but these suggested sizes make it easier to have the right size and age appropriate quilt available.

#### Quilts Beyond Borders:

40"- 45" wide & 48"- 60" long in kid friendly fabrics (https://quiltsbeyondborders.wordpress.com for more information)

#### Nursing Home Throws and Wheelchair Quilts:

Suggested sizes for wheelchair 38"-40" wide by 40"-46" long and for lap 50"-55" wide by 60"-70" long. (However, we will find homes for any size you make.) We need patriotic quilts for veterans. Their eyes light up when they see them and appreciate their service being recognized.

Twin and larger size quilts will be used for disaster relief.

## Membership

## **BINDING CLASS SUPPLY LIST**

# Tuesday, September 20 9:00 am to 1:00 pm United Electric Coop, 3200 Fall Creek Hwy (Park to back of lot)

- Machine in good working order and a full bobbin so you don't take time in class to wind a bobbin. Thread color does not matter.
- Basic sewing supplies: scissors, straight pins, etc.
- 2 different colors—1/4 yard by wof (not a fat quarter). Just something from your stash
- Long ruler for cutting binding, cutting mat and rotary cutter.
- Small ruler with 45 degree angle.
- Fabric marking pen (pencil, water erase or heat erase)
- Binding clips
- Hand sewing needle and thimble if you use one.
- There is a kit that you will need to buy for \$5.00. It contains all quilted fabric and supplies that is needed in class. Also instructions for all binding with samples of each. (Kit is included in the \$35 class fee).

#### SILK RIBBON EMBROIDERY SAMPLER CLASS

Tuesday, October 18 - cost is \$30 9:00 am to 3:00 at United Electric Coop

- Small Sharp Scissors
- Ruler
- 8" hoop
- Extension table for your machine, if you have one.
- 12" square of light colored fabric, 12" light-weight stabilizer (copy the pattern onto the fabric before class if possible. The pattern is on page 2 of the October Class.pdf attached to the email with the Newsletter.)
- Your favorite marking tool (water erasable blue marking pen is suggested)
- Clear thread (suggest Superior MonoPoly, size .004, Sulky Premier Invisible Polyester Monofilament, or Wonder Invisible Thread by YLI)
- A Straight Stitch Sewing Machine (We will be using a bare needle no foot on the machine.) It will be very helpful
  if your machine has "needle down", but not an absolute requirement. Practice sewing on your machine using the
  monofilament thread to see where to best set your tension with this thread.
- You can bring samples of unique yarns, threads or ribbons to try if we have the time.
- I will have the necessary kits for sale. Also, I'll have Xeroxed pages from Susan Schrempf's book, "Simple Ribbon Embroidery by Machine". I only have one of her books left for sale. They are not being published any longer, but they can still be found on Ebay and Amazon if anyone falls in love with this like I did!
- Required kits for purchase \$5 (not included in \$30 class fee).
- I also have Silk Ribbon for purchase, if you need it.
- Provided: Pattern, Sample threads and ribbons to try, and Xeroxed pages of sewing directions.
