DECEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH

BOM for December Meeting 12/19/22 Gray Leaf Extended Pinwheel


9" (9 ½") Pinwheel Centered Block

Requires 4 different fabrics. The gray leaf background print is provided for you. The long arms of the pinwheel should be a dull gold color. Goldenrod. Not yellow and not bright. Two additional colors are need from stash. Shades of gray, tan, another gold that match or blend well with the background fabric.

From the background fabriccut 4 each 3 ½" squaresplus 4 each 2" squares.From the dull gold fabriccut 4 each 3 ½ X 2" rectanglesplus 2 each 2 ½" squares.From each of the other two colors #3 and #4, cut one 2 ½" square and two 2" squares.

Match up each 2 1/2" gold square with colors #3 and #4 2 ½" squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the gold and sew two ½" seams on both sides of diagonal line. Then cut squares in half on the diagonal line to create 4 Half Square Triangle (HST) blocks. Trim to 2" if needed. Layout 2" units into a pinwheel. Assemble rows and then sew the rows together.

Sew the 4 gray 2" squares to the 4 other colored 2" squares. (Colors #3 and #4) Then after pressing sew the 3 ½" gold rectangles to the pieces just sewn. Layout your parts so the pinwheel goes together like the picture before sewing. Sew 3 rows per picture and then join rows for finished block.



There is extra background fabric for the winner of the blocks.



Community Service Committee (CSC)

For Harris Texas Health Resources Neonatal units:

(Any and all sizes are greatly appreciated) Preemie quilts (can be pastel or bright colors) 18" square to 36" square. Soft cottons or flannel on top and backing. No batting is needed for quilts using flannel. No tied quilts for these tiny ones. No fleece is allowed in the hospital, as fleece can harbor germs even after washing. Isolette covers 36"x46" made with batting. According to the NICU Neonatal Supervisor, Stephanie Eidson, the quiet darker environment of a covered isolette help the babies sleep and grow better.

Quilts of Valor:

60" x 80" with minimum of 55' x 65" and max of 72" x 90". Width of 55' - 72" and length of 65" - 90"

Nursing Home Throws and Wheelchair Quilts:

Suggested sizes for wheelchair 38"-40" wide by 40"-46" long and for lap 50"-55" wide by 60"-70" long. (However, we will find homes for any size you make.) We need patriotic quilts for veterans. Their eyes light up when they see them and appreciate their service being recognized. Twin and larger size quilts will be used for disaster relief.

We recognize that Community Service donation quilts IS an important part of the Granbury Quilters Guild. Therefore, to help facilitate the process of charity quilts, we ask that all members submit their COMPLETED QUILTS of various sizes along with the donation slip (s) at the monthly meetings. The CSC will be responsible for the delivery of such quilts. Please designate on the contribution slip which agency CSC should deliver.
