JULY BLOCK OF THE MONTH

CRISS-CROSS STARS

Lori Holt "Sew Your Stash Series #10 Criss-Cross Star Quilt Block". A fast easy block for July. Due by start of meeting 7/17/20

Finished block 12" (12 1/2" raw)

You will need 2 different black and white prints for background, and 5 different colored fabrics for center and star points. Watch Lori's video if you have a chance.

Cut four 4 1/2" squares from each of the black and white prints. Cut one 4 1/2" square from one of the

colored fabrics. Cut a total of eight 3 1/2" squares from the other 4 colored fabrics.

Draw one diagonal line across the back of each 3 1/2' square. Sew one star point onto each of the for of the one print background. Cut off excess triangle and press. Then sew a second 3 1/2" square to each. Cut off excess and press.

All that's left is to sew into 3 rows and then sew the rows together.

ing to bring a lot of necessities. (Ironing boards, cutting matts, design walls, etc).


I have renewed our annual membership of \$75.00.

Community Service Committee (CSC)

At our June meeting the following donations were made: 6 NICU quilts—1 Quilt of Valor; Undesignated, 1 Men's Lap Quilt, 2 Children's Quilts, 2 small Quilts

It is important that we keep track of donation guilts. To help facilitate the process, we ask that all members submit their completed quilts along with the donation slip(s) at the monthly meetings. Donation slips can be found at the membership table near where you sign in. Also, we all enjoy seeing your donation quilts at Show and Tell. There will be a tote marked Community Service available to place your guilts once you have shown your creation to the membership. The CSC will be responsible for the delivery of such guilts. Please be sure to designate on the donation slip if you wish to designate your guilt to a particular charity. If you want to designate your guilt, below is information on some categories.

Harris Texas Health Resources Neonatal Units:

(Any and all sizes are greatly appreciated). Preemie quilts (can be pastel or bright colors) 18" square to 36" square. Soft cotton or flannel on top and backing. No batting is needed for guilts using flannel. No tied guilts for these tiny ones. No fleece is allowed in the hospital as fleece can harbor germs even after washing. Isolette covers 36"x46" made with batting. We have been told the guiet darker environment of a covered isolette helps the babies sleep and grow better.

Quilts of Valor:

Nursing Home Throws and Wheelchair Quilts: Suggested sizes for wheelchair 38"-40" wide by 40"-46" long and for lap 50"-55" wide by 60"-70" long.

If you donate an undesignated guilt, we will find homes for any size you make. Twin and larger size guilts can be used for various charities we support as well as disaster relief.

Please remember to save your HOBBS BATTING UPC labels from your batting packages. Our guild can order batting for charity projects at a discounted price through their facility in Waco.
