Minutes of Granbury Quilt Guild June 17, 2024

At approximately 6:28 p.m. President, Joy Kelly, called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. She announced that the AQS jury committee has accepted our guild's quilts into the Ultimate Guild Challenge of the 2024 AQS QuiltWeek contest in the Grand Rapids, MI. She also announced that our Vice President Bonnie, Rhoby will be presenting tonight's program, entitled "How'd You Do That?" and gave a reminder that July's meeting will be an indoor picnic and garage sale. Let her know if you want a table to sell your items.

After Bonnie's presentation, the meeting was called back to order at 7:30 p.m.. Joy asked if everyone read last month's minutes in the newsletter. A motion was made to approve by Maryann Schiller and seconded by Linda Keithly. All voted aye. There were no nays.

Then Joy asked if everyone looked at last month's treasurer report in the newsletter. A motion to approve was made by Lynda Hyde and seconded by Sue Veal. All voted aye. There were no nays.

Joy mentioned that our most current membership file can be found on our website: granburyquiltguild.com under the Members only section. It is password protected. She gave out the password.

Then Barbara Fowler with Membership. Reported that there were 46 members present and 2 guests present. The guests introduced themselves and then they did the membership drawing. Joy then discussed that we are still working on getting dates and a location nailed down for our 2025 Quilt show. We were shooting for the Harvest Moon weekend, but the Convention Center was possibly already booked during that time. Our raffle quilt is ready to be taken to various quilt guild meetings to sell raffle tickets. Thank you to Kathy Cosand for donating the quilt. Gail Olney has volunteered to handle tickets. The drawing will be at our guild meeting in October 2024. Genda Marsh and Connie Scott took the quilt to Stephenville and Linda Keithly and Virginia Piles will take the quilt to Joshua next Monday. A list of other local quilt meetings are being circulated and we need help taking the quilt and selling tickets, so if you and a friend would like to take the quilt to a meeting and sell raffle tickets please get in touch me or Gail Olney.

We received notes from the recipients of the scholarships that were read aloud and they expressed their gratitude to our quilt guild.

Door Prizes - Linda Keithly and Angie Walters gave away the raffle ticket prizes.

Quilts of Valor - Gail Olney reported that the meeting will be this Wednesday at Patti's Last Resort and we will be making patriotic burrito pillowcases and that they recently awarded quilts of valor to a gentleman that was 102 years old and one for a disabled veteran.

Block of the Month – Kathy Tingly. Reported that there were 9 red/white/blue star blocks collected and Linda Steele was the winner of the blocks. Then she announced the July block was was called color wheel.

Community Service – Trisha Lenz and Rae Ellen Wilming. They reported quilts were donated to the fire victims.

JULY BLOCK OF THE MONTH

July Block of the Month 12" (12 ½") Color Me Bold Color Wheel (Size& Color Different) Block must be 12 ½" raw. If your block is ¾" too small or ¾" too large it will not be eligible to win the drawing for all blocks.

Fabric required and cutting instructions 8 each 4" off white squares

One each of 6 different shades 4" squares.

2 each 4" squares (see photo) striped fabric cut on point (start with stripe piece about 6" by 12")

You will need off white for the background – just off-white, not bright white or cream. 6 shades of one -two colors on the color wheel. If you choose blue then go to blue green or to blue violet. If you choose red then go to red orange or red violet. If orange then red orange or yellow orange. The colors should blend in your fabric choices.

Match a white square with each of your color shade squares. Sew and cut half square triangle squares, trimming each one to 3 1/2". For the stripes, be sure you sew PARALLEL to the stripe. See photo.

If you need to cut your squares 4 ¼" to be able to finish with 3 ½" HSTs then cut larger. If you need to trim your HSTs to 3 5/8" in order to have your rows measure 12 ½" then do that too. Do what is right for you so that your raw 12 ½" block actually measures 12 ½".

Community Service Committee (CSC)

It is important that we keep track of donation quilts. To help facilitate the process, we ask that all members submit their completed quilts along with the donation slip(s) at the monthly meetings. Donation slips can be found at the membership table near where you sign in. Also, we all enjoy seeing your donation quilts at Show and Tell. There will be a tote marked Community Service available to place your quilts once you have shown your creation to the membership. The CSC will be responsible for the delivery of such quilts. Please be sure to designate on the donation slip if you wish to designate your quilt to a particular charity.

If you want to designate your quilt, below is information on some categories. Harris Texas Health Resources Neonatal Units:

(Any and all sizes are greatly appreciated). Preemie guilts (can be pastel or bright colors) 18" square to 36" square. Soft cotton or flannel on top and backing. No batting is needed for quilts using flannel. No tied quilts for these tiny ones. No fleece is allowed in the hospital as fleece can harbor germs even after washing. Isolette covers 36"x46" made with batting. We have been told the quiet darker environment of a covered isolette helps the babies sleep and grow better.

Quilts of Valor: Contact Kathy Cosand and Gail Olney for details. The recommended size is 60" x 80"; it must be a minimum of 55" x 65" and maximum of 72" x 90".

Nursing Home Throws and Wheelchair Quilts: Suggested sizes for wheelchair 38"-40" wide by 40"-46" long and for lap 50"-55" wide by 60"-70" long.

Ada Carey Women's and Children's Shelter—Will accept any size up to 50x65 (throw size). Any size from a small quilt to wrap their upper body in up to a throw size. Children's guilts do not have to be fancy. Please make them in bright, child appropriate fabrics. They will be dragged around, machine washing and loved to pieces. Quilts for women as well as children appreciated. They often come in with nothing and giving them something of their own to snuggle in is so appreciated. These quilts should have no label.

If you donate an undesignated quilt, we will find homes for any size you make. Twin and larger size quilts can be used for various charities we support as well as disaster relief.

Please remember to save your HOBBS BATTING UPC labels from your batting packages. Our guild can order batting for charity projects at a discounted price through their facility in Waco.
